6. How would you answer someone who says that we needn't do apologetics because people are saved by faith, not by reason?
7. What are three reasons to engage in the study and practice of apologetics?
8. What are some encouraging developments in recent years pertaining to the evidences for the Christian faith.?
9. What is the limit of the usefulness of apologetics?
10. What was the most helpful thing you learned in this lesson, or was perhaps particularly new or interesting to you?
