- 1. For many years critics believed the Gospels were written as myth. What do most most modern historians and biblical scholars now consider the Gospels to be?
- 2. What are some of the reasons why the skeptical approach to the Gospels is not warranted.

- 3. Historians consider several markers that enhance our confidence that a text is historically authentic. What are some of them?
- 4. Does the absence of one or more of these markers render an account in the Gospels historically inauthentic?

- 5. How can we be confident that the Jesus of the Gospels is not a mere copy of characters from mythology?
- 6. Why does a point of similarity between Christianity and another religion not demonstrate that early Christians copied from that other religion?
- 7. What has recent scholarship revealed about the relative popularity of names in the Gospels with first-century Palestine. Why is this significant?
- 8. Why are a handful of relatively insignificant people in the Gospel records named, while most of the others remain anonymous?
- 9. From an historical perspective, how can we as Christians view the record of Jesus in the Gospels?
- 10. What was the most helpful thing you learned in this lesson, or was perhaps particularly new or interesting to you?
